


## **20 + C + M + B + 26**

Many of us have probably seen this inscription above a door. Some people may know what it is and what it means, others might think that a family just missed cleaning one of their kid's impromptu drawings. This inscription above the door is an Epiphany blessing.

The celebration of Epiphany celebrates the Magi (three wise men) coming to worship and bring their gifts to Christ, the king. This blessing, written above the door in a house or other building is asking Christ to bless this home. Here is what the inscription means. The 20 in the beginning and the 26 on the end make up the year that the blessing is for, in our case 2026. The little pluses that you see separating each part are crosses, rather than plus signs. The final piece of this inscription are the letters: C, M, and B. These stand for two things because we, Catholics, believe in both/and answers. It stands for the initials of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. It also stands for the Latin phrase: "Christus Mansionem Benedicat", which means "May Christ bless this house." You will find both the chalk and pamphlets explaining how to do this blessing on the table in the entry of the Church.

When you are blessing the door frame in your house, since I can't be in multiple locations at once, the father or head of the household is the one who takes the role of the priest for this blessing. It is the proper role of the father to serve as the priest for his family. If this is not possible, and unfortunately sometimes it is not possible for all families, the role of the priest's parts in this blessing would then be done by the oldest woman living there in the home. If you have children or other people that you want to involve, you can have them write the C, M, and B on the doorframe. The rest of the pamphlet is written so that you say the black font text and do the red font text. You will also need holy water which you can get from the silver canister located in the Church.

I pray that all of you have a blessed Epiphany. May the Lord bless your families, homes, and all who visit you. This is another way that we as Catholics spread the kingdom of God into our homes and places of work.
