

What will we bring him?

This Sunday we celebrate Epiphany. It is the celebration of the wise men coming to present their gifts to the king. The wise men who are not Israelites demonstrates that this new king is king over the nations, not just the Jewish nations. They come bearing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. They have traveled far to bring these gifts to the newborn king. What gifts do we bring him?

The very same king that the three wise men came to worship becomes truly present on the altar at every mass. The question of “what do we bring him” fits naturally within the prayer of the mass. The time of the preparation of the gifts, the time when the ushers collect the offerings of the people and bring it up to the priest to place before the altar, is a fitting time to imagine what we are bringing. The collection of the money that is brought forward is not just the people’s offerings, but it also represents the other offerings that people lay before the altar. Jesus wants every part of us, so he wants us to lay more than just money at the foot of the altar. When this time is happening, imagine the things of this last week that you want to give over to Jesus. It might be frustration with the weather, joy at blessings received during the week, or concern for family and friends.



Whatever is happening in our lives during the week, Jesus wants us to bring it before his altar to offer it to him. Imagine yourself laying all the things that are happening in your life at the foot of the altar to be given to the King of Kings.
