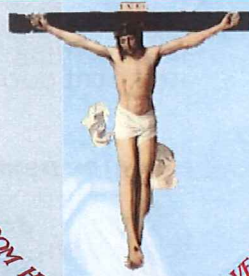

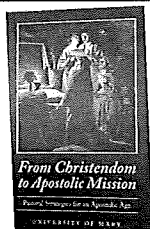

Jesus- friend or Bridegroom?

“How did you meet?” This is always a fun question that I get to ask couples, and it is enjoyable to watch their reactions. There are usually a variety of facial responses that I see from a coy smirk to this quiet joy as the couple remembers how they came to meet. It is amazing to me how common it is to see people’s faces light up when they think back to how they met their spouse even decades ago. That question brings back memories of the joy and the newfound love for this other person. It also seems common that during that first budding love, the couple spent a lot of time talking and seeking to spend time together.

I hear people speak about how they have a personal relationship with Jesus, which we are all called to have. The question arises, is Jesus someone that you talk to as a distant friend or as a close friend like your spouse? I know that I have buddies that I loosely call “friends”, and we may not speak for months at a time, then we may call and spend a couple of hours catching up. Then there are close friends that I speak with on a weekly basis. We use this term friend very broadly from describing acquaintances online to the person that you chose to spend your whole life with.

Jesus does not want to be your “friend” that you speak to once in a blue moon. He wants to speak with you every day, and for you to speak with him. He wants to be so close to us to give us his very body in the Eucharist every week at mass. Just as when you first met your spouse you wanted to talk with them, spend time with them, and be with them, so the Lord desires to be with us. It is that time that we spend being with him throughout the week that enriches our time spent with him at mass. Let us ask for that desire to remain close to the Lord not only on Sunday, but all throughout the week. Our Lord desires to be that close to each of us.
