

Giving Permission

Can you imagine what it was like for Zebedee in the gospel when Jesus called James and John to follow him? The gospel doesn't tell us of how he responded, but I think that we can guess.

I find that this story resonates deeply with my own vocation story. I have shared that I grew up on a small family ranch, and that I wanted to take over that ranch. For as long as I can remember, I wanted to raise a family and carry on the tradition. My grandfather bought the ranch, my dad took it over from him, and I was going to take it over from my dad. My father and I are close and worked together all the time since my only siblings are my two younger sisters.

The plan started to change during my senior year of high school. That was when the invitation from the Lord became clearer that he was inviting me to the seminary. I applied and was getting ready to go in the fall. My mother was encouraging, but it was my father who gave me permission to go. I can still remember the moment during the summer in between high school and seminary. He told me that he supported me no matter what God called me to and without that, I would not have gone. If he would have told me to do anything else, I would not have gone to seminary that year, and who knows what my life would look like now.

I would bet that if Zebedee had objected, his sons might have responded differently as well. So, do you pray for your children or grandchildren to follow God's call for their life? If that call was to priesthood or consecrated life, would you give them permission? If that thought causes your heart fear, then bring it to Jesus. Ask him to show you the root of that fear so that you can give your children permission to follow wherever Jesus leads.
