

## The Presentation of the Lord- Candlemas

Next Sunday we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord, another name that it is given is Candlemas Day. This day celebrates when the Lord is revealed by Simeon and Anna in the temple that he will be a light to the nations. He is the light shining in the darkness and the darkness cannot overcome it.

This is the day of the year when we bless all the candles that we use in the Church, whether for mass or devotional candles. These candles are blest or "set apart" for a sacred purpose. How special and sacred is what we do at mass that even the candles that are used to draw our attention are "set apart" for the purpose of worshipping God.

The Church calls that the candles should either be wax or oil, but the preference is wax. The reason is because the wax candles are giving of themselves to provide light for all to see. This is also a reminder for all of us that we too are called to be light to the world. For us to be light, we must give of ourselves. When we give of ourselves, share our gifts and talents for building up the kingdom, it does give away something of ourselves. However, it also makes room in our hearts for Jesus to pour more of his grace into them. A good example of this is when you damn a stream, the water becomes stagnant, mucky, and gross. Yet, when the stream can flow out it leaves room for new water to flow in. All this is to say that as we pour out ourselves, Jesus fills us with his graces. If we try to just cling to that grace and do not give of ourselves then our spiritual lives can become stagnant.

Finally, when we bless the candles for the Church next Sunday at mass, I can also bless your candles as well. So, if you have candles that you want blest, please bring them next weekend and place them in front of the altar for any of the four weekend masses. I will bless them with the others, and you can take your candles home at the end of mass. You can then burn them at home to give light to your home, and they can also serve as a reminder that we too are invited to be light to the world.
