What is the significance of the Stations of the Cross?

In the very earliest days of the Church, this would be the time of year when Christians would make pilgrimages to the Holy Land. These were perilous and arduous journeys, requiring incredible sacrifices on the part of anyone setting out. Pilgrimages were made on foot, sometimes requiring weeks to complete, at the mercy of villains, and relying on the generous hospitality of good people along the way. Why in the world would they subject themselves to this suffering? Because they desired to share in the suffering of Christ's passion. Because they knew that to share in His suffering so profoundly, they could also receive profound cleansing from their sins. This penance was a religious requirement for many Christians, but a penance that they were happy to undergo for a share in Christ's resurrection. As time passes by, this pilgrimage is made more attainable to all Catholics by participating in the Stations of the Cross. Each of these 14 stations represents real, physical places in Jerusalem, where pilgrims would pause and reflect on the events which took place during our Lord's passion. We may not be able to make the long journey to the Holy Land, but we may still participate in the Stations of the Cross each Friday. This is still the annual pilgrimage we make, although a 'mini-pilgrimage', so that we may still find our hope renewed in the redemptive suffering of Christ. Recall, too, that the Holy Land pilgrimage always ends with a visit to the Holy Sepulchre, the empty tomb. That is where our Lenten pilgrimage is leading – to a share in his Risen Life!

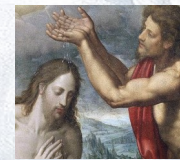

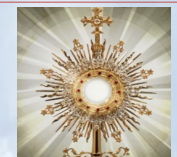
MATRIMONY

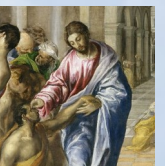
