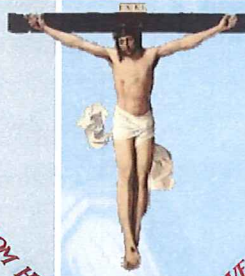

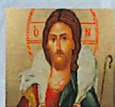

## Adventure of a Lifetime

There is something about us that loves adventure stories whether it is the Chronicles of Narnia, The Cowboys, Lonesome Dove, or Lord of the Rings, we are drawn to stories of adventure. I think we love these stories because the main character is essential. The hero's life and journey have great meaning, and we enjoy seeing the hero forged by the journey into the mature character that he needs to become to triumph. There is something in our heart that wants to be a part of a great adventure where we are forged through the fire to triumph over great odds at the end. Although if we were given our choice we would rather just be made equipped so that we would not have to go through the forge. However, we want the hero's triumphant welcome, for our life to have great meaning, and have the honor of conquering the enemy.

Do we ever think of our journey of faith as an epic adventure? Our time here on earth is a time of testing. It is a journey towards God or away from God whichever we choose. The choices that we make now, form that eternal choice. So, the things here and now are both of little importance and of great value. The things of this earth are of little importance because they are passing away. The fleeting pleasures of today are gone tomorrow, and so many things that we worry about are not that big in the grand scheme of things. However, the things of this world and how we use them will help us to grow closer to God or further away from him. In that regard, the things of this world and the people who are all created to be immortal (without end), are of infinite importance.

I wrote last week that we live in two worlds simultaneously, the physical world and the spiritual world. For Catholics, we see the physical world around us differently because this is our great adventure that leads to our life in the next. Another thing that we might notice with those adventure stories is that it is not the grand moments that change and mold the hero as much as the small moments. It is often the small moments and changes that forge us to be saints. It might be a moment when you want to be frustrated with your spouse or kids, and you pause for a moment, pray "Jesus, help me," and respond with love instead. It may be the choice of praying the morning offering prayer as you are getting ready in the morning. Then taking seven minutes to pray the daily Examine prayer at night. Maybe it is when you drop your children off at Faith Formation that you stop into the church for 5 minutes to say hi to Jesus and to tell him thank you. These little moments help to forge us, and they help us in the spiritual battle that we are engaged in.

Just like adventurers face various battles along the way to the final battle, so do we. We fight against the wounds of sin in our own hearts and the evil one who tempts us away from God. The Church refers to this as Spiritual warfare and she tells us all the tactics that the evil one uses. The Church also gives us the spiritual weapons to fight against these tactics. Our life and our faith are a great adventure that is hidden behind the veil of the boring day to day. No matter where we are in our adventure with Jesus, it is never too early or too late to dive deeper into the adventure. He calls us to greatness, and he helps and equips us along the journey to triumph. We only need to keep saying yes.
