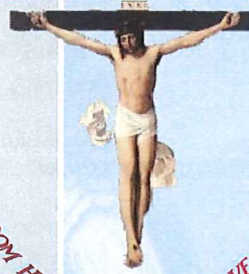

Spiritual Warfare

If I may continue with the adventure or medieval imagery from last week's reflection, I want to touch on the topic of spiritual warfare. This is a great part of the adventure of our lives because the battle is not done for us. This is a time of testing for us to see which side we will choose to fight for. We are engaged in spiritual warfare, and one of the enemy's tactics is that he tries to keep this truth hidden from us.

St. Ignatius gives this image of the evil one. The enemy conducts himself as a leader, intent upon conquering and robbing what he desires. For, just as a captain and leader of an army in the field, pitching his camp and exploring the fortifications and defenses of a stronghold, attacks it at the weakest point, in the same way the enemy of human nature, roving about, looks in turn at all our theological, cardinal, and moral virtues; and where he finds us weakest and most in need for our eternal salvation, there he attacks us and attempts to take us. (Rules of Discernment, rule #14)

When the evil one attacks and probes at our defenses to look for our weaknesses, he does not usually do it by a full charge assault. If he did it that way, then we could much more easily recognize it as a temptation and flee to God for help. Rather, he tempts us in small ways; slowly tries to chip away at that weak spot. He offers small temptations and if we commit those small sins, they lead to bigger ones because our conscience becomes duller. Allow me to give an example to flesh this out.

Let's say that I had the mortal sin of skipping Sunday mass on my soul. It was mortal because I knew that it was a grave sin to miss Sunday mass, and I freely chose it because I just did not feel like going that Sunday. I bring it to confession, do my penance, and am in the state of grace again. Let's also say that I have the spiritual practice of praying the morning offering prayer when I get ready each morning. After I am set free in confession, the enemy is not going to tempt me to just skip mass again right away because I would respond with absolutely not! He might instead tempt with, "you are in a hurry this morning, so you do not have to say that morning offering this morning, God will understand, you can do it tomorrow." If we still say the morning offering, then we have beaten that temptation, we foiled his attack. If we skip it, then the next day we hear, "you are tired this morning, and you skipped the morning offering yesterday, it would be fine to skip it today too." Do you see how it slowly builds? He might then tempt with other small sins; as we say yes to them, then it gets easier to say yes to the sin, and harder to say yes to God. Then we may get back to a point where the evil one tempts us to skip mass because we do not feel like going and it will be harder to say no to that temptation.

This is why making a habit of going to confession on a regular basis (every month or six weeks) can be a huge boost to our growth in holiness. First, it helps us to come before we fall into mortal sin, and confession gives us grace to resist falling into sin. Secondly, we can start to notice the pattern, I often confess the same sins. That shows me where my defenses are weakest, but if I know that, then I can start working to strengthen those defenses. I can become more aware of where and how the evil one attacks me. Thirdly, it can be easier to come to confession when I have a list of some venial sins instead of grave or mortal ones. Fourthly, your confessor can help give you advice on how to build the opposing virtue to the areas that you struggle in.

This barely scratches the surface of spiritual warfare, but I can go deeper if there is an interest. In short, spiritual warfare teaches us not only the ways that the evil one attacks us, but it also shows us how we can fight against those attacks so that we may triumph.
