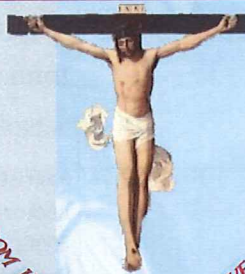

Why are Catholic Churches so extravagant? Some people may wonder why we spend so much money and effort to adorn our Churches. The beautiful vestments, the gold chalice that holds Jesus' blood, the paten that holds his body, and the beautiful Church buildings, at first glance, it can all seem like too much. So, why do we do it?
