
Come out of hiding

"I heard you in the garden; but I was afraid, because I was naked, so I hid myself" (Gen 3:10). This line comes from Genesis after Adam and Eve have eaten of the forbidden tree in the garden. They realize that they are naked, they are vulnerable. So, they hide themselves and they make the first clothing for themselves. This is one of the great hardships of the fall is that we realize that we are vulnerable, we can be used and hurt. Therefore, we "cloth ourselves" or we work to hide our vulnerabilities, weaknesses, and insecurities. This is a smart and good thing to do. It is unwise to wear your heart on your sleeve, or to tell everyone everything about yourself. We learn to be choosy about sharing ourselves with people whom we trust.

I preached last Sunday about how the goal of prayer is to connect our heart with God's heart. There are various methods by which we can accomplish this, but the ultimate goal is entrusting my heart to the Lord including all the parts of myself that I do not like. That can be difficult because we usually treat our relationship with the Lord like our relationship with others. We share the parts of our hearts that we like and hide the parts that we don't. There can be various ways and things that we can hide behind.

Jesus says in the gospel, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions" (Lk 12:15). Money and possessions are not evil in themselves, but they will not last. When we stand before the Lord at the end of time, the money and things that we have acquired will be stripped away. If we use any earthly thing to hide ourselves, or have it become our means of security, it will not last.

Rather, as we grow in our life of prayer, we let go of these earthly masks and facades so that we can be known as we are. This is not to say that God cannot see through our hiding, but that our view of him is inaccurate when we only relate to him



through our mask. Prayer helps us to grow closer to the Lord to see that he makes himself vulnerable first. If you look at an image of the Sacred Heart, his heart is not guarded or protected. It is given away in love for each of us, not as a faceless group, but as individuals that he sees, loves, and calls out of hiding to live in communion with him.
