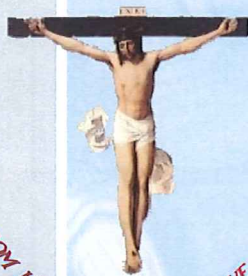

Today, I must stay at your house (Lk 19:1-10)

I can remember growing up that I always knew when we were going to have guests visit our home because we “got to clean the house.” It was not just picking things up so that it doesn’t look like a mess, but it was deep clean the house. Granted, it is not very welcoming to your guests for your house to look like a pack of hyenas lives in it. Our house did not usually look like that (just in case my family ever reads this), but it did look lived in. I would also bet that we are not the only people who did this. I think that for many of us, we want to make sure that everything is perfectly ordered before we invite people to enter our house. We are taught to always put your best foot forward. This habit plays out both with our physical houses, and with our spiritual lives as well.

I heard a speaker at one point give the analogy of our heart being like a house where the Lord stands at the door and knocks. The heart gives an image of our inner life and the parts of ourselves that we allow others to see and know. There are different rooms and areas that we allow people to enter and see. Some areas are more public where we allow more people to see those parts of us, and some are more private that we only allow a select few to see or maybe no one but myself.

I invite you to read through the story of Zacchaeus in Luke chapter 19 verses 1-10. It will give more food for thought, and it can also help us to put ourselves in Zacchaeus’ place in the story. This is a way of praying with scripture. The last time that I prayed with this passage, I was struck by a couple of things. First, that Jesus intended to pass through the town of Jericho, but when he sees Zacchaeus climbed the tree to see him, he chose to stay in his home. Secondly, I was also struck by the joy that Zacchaeus has when Jesus says, “Today, I must stay at your home.” I imagine the love and compassion that Jesus’ gaze must have given to Zacchaeus that upon receiving this invite, he has a large conversion of life.

How would I respond if Jesus told me today, “Today, I must stay at the home of your heart”? I had a time when I had the Lord ask me that question. I found that when I let him in and began showing him around the house, I apologized numerous times about the mess that there was. There were some areas where I did not want him to go because I did not have those parts put in order yet. I was struck by Jesus’ response. He told me, “I am not afraid of your mess. I desire to stay there because it is not perfectly in order. I want to order it with you so that we can both be at home here.”

I find that my house is not perfectly ordered yet. It is a working order with other parts still very much a work in progress. Some places have an order and organization that is apparent. There are other places that are still more mess than not. The reassuring part is that Jesus is slow and deliberate about ordering the house. He does not take over and change everything around. Rather, he is slowly helping me to put things in their proper order and place.

When the Lord knocks at the door, he waits for our invitation to enter. He desires to stay in the home of our hearts with us. So, how do you respond to Jesus’ invitation, “Today, I must stay at your house”?
