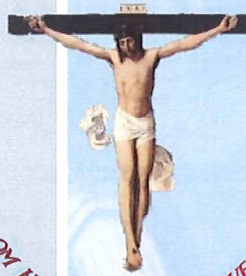

Never out done in Generosity

I have shared my vocation story with many people, and I have freely shared that I was hesitant about discerning priesthood. I had a number of fears including, the fear of if I give my life over to the Lord in this major way, what will happen with it. Will I still find joy? Will I have enough for what I need? Will the Lord give me anything in return for what he is asking me to give to him? These were all pressing questions in my mind. My pastor at that time told me, "God is never out done in generosity." Whatever we give to him he will return numerous blessings back to us that far outweighs the gift that we gave to him.

One example among many was my prayer time in the busy schedule of seminary. The schedule is full between your classes, homework, formation classes, jobs around the dorm, apostolic works, and making time for prayer. We were expected to do a holy hour (an hour of meditative prayer) each day. There were days that I cut out my holy hour in order to make more time for the other things that I had to get accomplished. That never actually helped. It seemed that I had more time, but I got less stuff done. However, the days that I was faithful to giving God that time of prayer, especially first thing in the morning, I got far more done in the time that I had. The Lord blessed me as I gave him that time of prayer, he made it so that I could get done all of the other things that I needed to accomplish for that day with time to spare.

Recently, I had a gentleman tell me that years ago he was working to chase the dollar. He was giving to the Lord from what he had left over, and he felt that he was burning himself out trying to chase the thirty pieces of silver. He and his wife got into a difficult spot and decided that they were going to tithe (give a tenth of their income to the Church). He said that they went through bankruptcy, but they continued to give from what little they had. He said that now the Lord has so greatly blessed him financially that he can afford to work for the Church.

I don't have room here to write all of the examples, but I can promise you that God is never out done in generosity. When we give of our time, talent, and treasure to him, he always pours out greater blessings in return. It may not be the same way, but the Lord does pour out his blessings. Let me be clear, this is not the prosperity gospel. I am not saying that because you give generously of your time, talent, and treasure that everything will go perfectly and there will never be the cross. I'm also not saying that if you give generously of your treasure to the Lord today that he will make you win the Powerball tomorrow... (but if he does, remember the Church). The fear that if we give generously to the Lord that I will not have enough for what I need is not from the Lord. When we give generously of ourselves to the Lord, we will find that what we have left will become more than enough for what we need.

We live in a world that is constantly telling us, "look after yourself first; get as much as you can get; make sure that you have what you need before looking after someone else..." The idea of the culture is look after your needs first then give to God from whatever is left over. There have been times that I have tested that theory in certain ways; I often found that I had very little left over for the Lord. However, when I gave to the Lord first, there was an abundance left over that surpassed what I needed. It is true that the Lord is never outdone in generosity, he has blessed me beyond measure, and far beyond what I ever could have asked for.

"Jesus said, 'Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses, and brothers and sisters..., with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come' (Mk 10:29-31).
