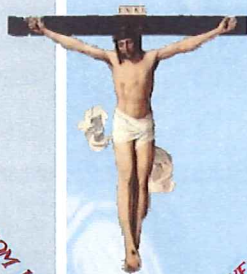

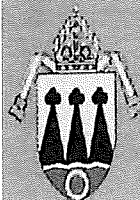

Making space for God

We are blessed in the Catholic Tradition to have an abundance of spiritual masters who have taught us about the spiritual life, and the variety of ways that our Father works to lead us to him. These many spiritual masters have written on the ways that God has worked in their lives. When we learn the ways that God has led them to himself, it teaches us how he works in our lives to lead us into this deeper union with him.

The book that I recently read on retreat was *The Impact of God* by Fr. Iain Matthew which gives an overview of St. John of the Cross. I found it very helpful to grow in understanding the rich treasures that St. John has given us. My thoughts on this page will be more of an unjust simplification of the riches that Fr. Matthew seeks to unpack. So, I would recommend this book, and I found it to be a good read.

St. John describes God as a God who pursues us and who seeks to fill us with himself. He desires to give himself to us. God is always the initiator in our relationship with him. He is always providing grace first, and we are responding to his grace. This is why the song *Amazing Grace* is wrong when it states that God's grace appeared when I first believed. God's grace does not come because of our action. Our action is ALWAYS a response to his grace. Our response is then for St. John is to make space for God to fill. The different things that we attach ourselves to fills up that space so there is no room for God. God then works to purify us of those attachments so that we can have room for him.

Imagine a little kid walking down a gravel road with his dad. As they are walking the little kid stops to pick up every "neat rock" that he finds. In a short bit, his pockets, arms, hands, and every spare space that he can find are filled with rocks. Therefore, when the Father wants to give something to the child, he has no room to receive it. So, the Father works to get the kid to set down some of these rocks so that he has room in his hands and arms to receive what the Father wishes to give to him. We are like that child who fills our arms full of rocks, and the Father wants to help us set down those rocks so that we can have room for him.

These rocks can be any number of things that we hold onto to fill that space in our hearts that is meant for God. They can be love of comforts, sins, honor, money, career, our way of life, people, love for noise and distraction and so on. It can be scary to set them down. That can be frightening because the God sized hole in our hearts becomes more obvious. This is part of the reason why we are so uncomfortable with silence especially when our mind quiets from the rolling to-do list. The silence makes the things of our hearts more apparent. St. John describes this God-sized hole as one of infinite size because it is made for a being who is infinite. It is also scary because God is outside of our control.

I loved St. John's description of God. He describes God as the one who seeks us out, and who is looking to fill us with himself. He is not one who waits to love us once we are made rather he loves us and pursues us. He calls for us to make space for him so that he can fill us with himself.
