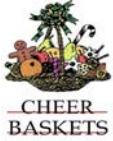

"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government will be upon his shoulder, and his name will be called 'Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.' The History of the Advent Wreath

Advent symbolizes the coming of Christmas, when His only Son was born in Bethlehem.

The celebration of the Advent Wreath originated in Germany, where each candle represents one of the four Sundays of Advent. Each candle holds a special meaning, prayers, scriptures, and celebrations associated with the lighting of that candle.

There are three purple candles, one pink candle and one white candle. The purple candles symbolize penance, prayer and preparation for the coming of Christ. The pink candle represents the midpoint of Mary and Joseph's journey, and being that much closer to the coming of Christ.

The white candle represents the Light of the World, Jesus Christ. We light this candle on Christmas day to rejoice in His arrival!
